1. About NAPGT

The Native American Professional Golf Tour (NAPGT) is a professional and elite amateur golf tour dedicated to Indigenous golfers across North America. Our mission is to create world-class competitive opportunities while honoring culture, sovereignty, and community.



2. What It Means to Be a Host Nation

As a Host Nation, your community becomes the featured home of an official NAPGT tour stop. Your course, resort, or casino facility will welcome professional and amateur Indigenous golfers, youth participants, sponsors, media, and visitors.



3. Benefits to the Host Nation

- Economic impact from visitors and players
- Increased visibility for your Nation, resort, or casino
- Youth engagement through junior golf clinics
- Cultural showcase with drum groups, dancers, artists, and vendors
- Long-term branding as a key location on the Indigenous golf map









4. Host Nation Responsibilities

- Provide access to an 18-hole golf course in tournament condition
- Support basic tournament operations (cart access, staff coordination, clubhouse access)
- Confirm dates in coordination with NAPGT schedule
- Designate a Host Nation Event Liaison to work with NAPGT staff
- Support cultural programming (elders, drummers, dancers, speakers)









5. NAPGT Responsibilities

- Provide tournament operations framework and format
- Supply branding templates (banners, signage, graphics)
- Coordinate player registration and communication
- Promote the event through NAPGT media channels
- Support sponsor engagement and purse funding discussions



6. Event Format (Standard Model)

- 2-3 day event with practice round option
- Professional & Elite Amateur divisions (36–54 holes)
- Junior/Youth clinic hosted on-site
- Opening cultural ceremony and land acknowledgement
- Awards ceremony with cultural gifting and recognition









7. Financial Structure & Purses

Event purses are built through contributions from:

- NAPGT central partners and sponsors
- Host Nation sponsorships and local partners
- · Casino, resort, or hotel partners attached to the course

Host Nations may choose to:

- Contribute directly to the event purse
- Provide in-kind support (rooms, meals, transportation)
- Invite local sponsors to be recognized as Supporting or Presenting Sponsors.









8. Facilities & Infrastructure Checklist

Ideal Host Nation facilities include:

- 18-hole golf course with practice area
- Clubhouse or event space
- Nearby or on-site accommodations (hotel, lodge, casino, resort)
- Parking and access for players and guests
- Space for cultural performances and vendor booths
- Wi-Fi or connectivity for scoring and media (preferred but flexible)









9. Sample Event Timeline

Day 1: Practice rounds, player check-in, evening welcome

Day 2: Round 1 (all divisions) + youth clinic and cultural programming

Day 3: Final round, awards ceremony, closing prayer and acknowledgements

Exact schedule is customized with each Host Nation.
